Year 13- Onsite Tuesday afternoons and Unitec one day a week Students will complete Level 2 Building, Construction and Allied Trades Industry Standards (BCATS) These Standards and the experience gained will prepare students well for apprenticeships or for preapprenticeship training at tertiary level.

Year 13/ Level 3—Onsite Tuesday afternoons and work experience one day a week in the Engineering sector.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This is an Academy that operates at Waitakere College.

This course offers a pathway for possible progression towards the police, armed forces and other related services.

This program is for students who can benefit from direction, structure and personal discipline. The course involves military drill, physical training, leadership skills and outdoor training.

Year 12 / Level 2 in the Academy are involved in at least three overnight training camps over the year, supported by the Youth Development Unit of the armed services.

Year 13/ Level 3 students have a training camp and take part in Tough Guy, Tough Girl.

ENTRY:

This course is by application. Students must see Staff Priore, Ms Fugmann or Mrs Carter for an application form.

COSTS:

Students entering the academy must commit to paying the up-front costs for PT gear and uniform. The cost is yet to be finalised but will be over \$250.

Course: Mahi a Toi Academy - AWVA

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This is a one year Academy that operates at Rutherford College allowing students to gain credits in Mahi a Toi and gain experience and preparation for a higher level of tertiary study.

Students go off site one day a week to Rutherford College 2pm - 6pm Students learn to analyse factors that influence the quality of individual performance in applied settings. Units based on Toi Maori which covers Ta Moko, Maori Performing Arts, Whakairo, Korero and Kowhaiwhai are covered.

UNITEC one day a week in Term 2.

Students will complete credits towards NCEA Level 2 in Moteatea, Waiata-a-ringa, Visual Arts, Te Tauira Whakairo.
