Note: Civil emergency may include (but is not limited to) – fire, earthquake, bomb scare, flood, storm, volcanic activity, tsunami, armed offender, pandemic

## GOAL

To ensure the safety of students and staff is maintained during a response to an emergency and the immediate post impact recovery.

## GUIDELINES

- 1. Civil Defence or other associated emergency services directives will be followed. The College will contact emergency services and/or Auckland City Civil Defence Headquarters for instructions and information.
- 2. Staff and students will be informed of the emergency procedures:
  - notices displayed prominently by entry doorways
  - Regular training and emergency
- 3. Communication with the local community/families/whānau will be maintained as is practicable (through email/ college website/ digital)
- 4. The College will conduct regular practice drills to enable all members of the College community to familiarise themselves with emergency management in a variety of contexts.
- 5. The College will conduct regular evaluations of all practices relating to Emergency Management
- 6. The College as part of its Building Warrant of Fitness will ensure its alarm bells and evacuation exits are maintained.
- 7. In the event of a pandemic, the college will follow the Ministry of Health and Ministry of Education guidelines. Refer to Pandemic Policy.
- 8. We will follow-'emergency evacuation' procedures displayed publicly.
